## JBFCS Friends are key link for Holiday Gift Program

n a recent Sunday, a group of young adults from JBFCS Friends traveled to the agency warehouse in Jersey City, New Jersey where they walked across the vast storage space laid out with bins of toys marked Girls or Boys Ages 0-2, 2-4, 4-6 and on up to the teen years. Each volunteer gathered toys, games and stuffed animals for four hours with time out for a coffee break and conversation.

By day's end, 30 oversized boxes were packed with more than 2000 gifts ready for delivery on December 1 to children under the care of JBFCS counseling

centers, preventive services, day treatment and residential programs.

It's all part of the Holiday Gift Program by Volunteer Services, which also coordinates JBFCS Friends, a program for men and women in their 20s and 30s who choose from a variety of activities to support the agency's services.

"We've run this holiday gift program for more than 15 years," says Jamie Bloom, MBA, Director, Volunteer Services. "And we've relied on Robert Reyes, Maintenance Worker/Driver, for the past

13 years to deliver all of the boxes on time. He makes round trips between Jersey City and JBFCS programs in the five boroughs and Westchester, Robbie's never been late."

This year, JBFCS applied for a holiday giving program through Hasbro, a toy producer, and was selected by a lottery system to receive 15 boxes of board games and toys. The NBC "Today" Show Toy Drive makes a generous contribution annually, and other vendors donate as well.

The Holiday Gift Program also welcomes monetary contributions which are used for

stipends. Programs typically provide stipends for holiday celebrations and special items, such as a ping pong table which Brooklyn-based Break-Free Adolescent Services will purchase for their youth lounge.

"The program is an easy way for volunteers to feel a part of the giving spirit of the holidays," notes Lisa Marcus, LMSW, Program Manager.

With the help of JBFCS Friends, more than 2,600 children in treatment at JBFCS will have a more festive holiday season this December.
