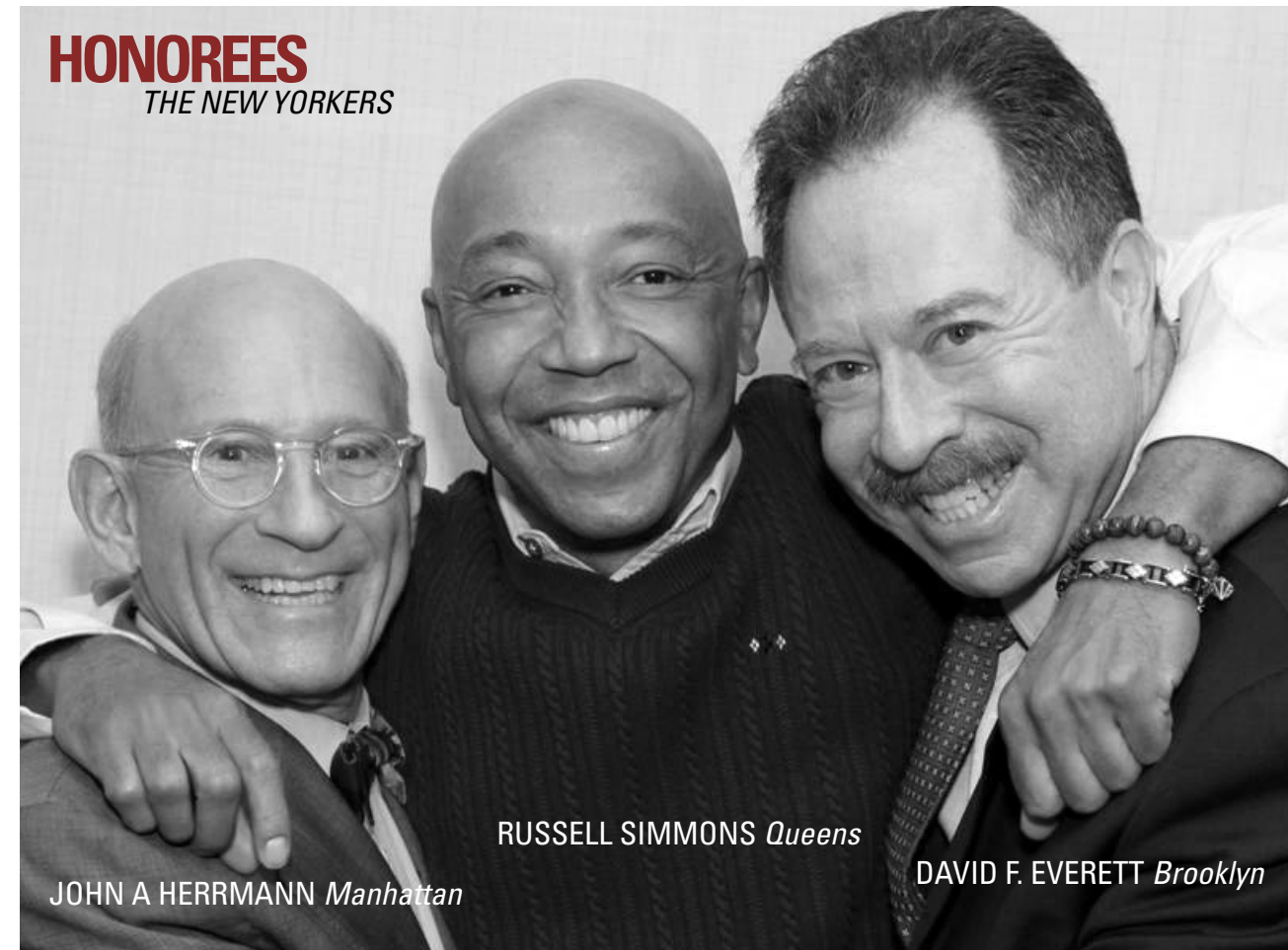

RUSSELL SIMMONS

Originally from Queens, USA Today recently named Russell Simmons one of the “Top 25 Most Influential People of the Past 25 Years,” calling him a “hip-hop pioneer” for his groundbreaking vision that has influenced music, fashion, finance, television and film, as well as the face of modern philanthropy. From creating his seminal Def Jam Recordings in 1984, to the 2007 publishing of his New York Times best-seller Do You! 12 Laws to Access the Power in You to Achieve Happiness and Success, Russell is recognized globally for his influence and entrepreneurial approach to both business and philanthropy. As Chairman and CEO of Rush Communications, he has consistently leveraged his influence in the recording industry, fashion, television, financial services, and jewelry sectors to give back. A devoted yogi and social activist, Russell also leads the non-profit division of his empire, Rush Community Affairs, and its ongoing commitment to empowering at-risk youth through

Co-founder of the Foundation for Ethnic Understanding, Russell also serves as UN Goodwill Ambassador For The Permanent Memorial To Honor The Victims Of Slavery and The Trans-Atlantic Slave Trade.

DAVID F. EVERETT

A Brooklyn native, David is an attorney in private practice concentrating in civil litigation with an extensive career in both military and civilian public service. During Operation Desert Storm in 1991, David, then a Major in the Army Reserve, volunteered for active duty and served in Saudi Arabia, Iraq and Kuwait. In 2005, as a Colonel, he volunteered for service in Operation Iraqi Freedom and was assigned to the Civilian Police Assistance Training Team. Working from a forward operating base in Bagh-

dad, David was the principal Coalition Forces advisor to the Director of Internal Affairs of Iraq's Ministry of Interior. Operation Enduring Freedom saw David volunteer again for active duty, deploying in 2009 to Afghanistan as a Senior Military Advisor to the Chief of Police of Kabul. David was twice awarded the Bronze Star for his service in both Operations Desert Storm and Iraqi Freedom and the Department of Defense Meritorious Service Medal for his service in Afghanistan. Having started out as a Big Brother with JBFCS in 1981, David is currently a Vice President of the Board and a trustee for nearly 20 years. He is also a member of the Executive Committee of the Board of Visitors of the City University of New York School of Law. David is married to the former Karen Lee Hertz and the father of Elias, Ethan and Hannie.
